PARENT TEACHER INTERVIEWS TERM ONE

These interviews will be conducted in Week 7 from 7-11 March of this term. The oldest student from each family will be sent home shortly an invitation for you to go online to select your preferred times. This invitation will include the log on procedures. Feedback from our trial of this booking system last year was very positive.

These interview sessions provide valuable time for parents and teachers to discuss individual student progress and share information. Written Reports will provide feedback on progress for Semester One and are distributed to parents at the end of Term 2.

INVESTING FOR SUCCESS FUNDS \$213,827

Previously known as the Great Results Guaranteed Funding the Australian Government has continued to fund schools to support students, particularly those most in need.

The aim is to achieve improved outcomes at all levels of schooling.

Below is the focus and strategies developed to meet the needs of our students at Bald Hills State School.

- Commit to guarantee that every student will achieve the National Minimum Standard for literacy and numeracy for their year level or have an evidence based Individual Learning Plan in place.
- * Review and enhance the School Data Plan to diagnose and plan for intervention.
- Commit to achieving the following upper 2 band targets in NAPLAN Reading (Year 3: 50% / Year 5: 55%) and Numeracy (Year 3: 35% / Year 5: 45%).
- * Improve teacher capability through focused coaching and professional development to improve student performance that is the focus of pedagogical practice.
- Procure additional physical and human resources to support Literacy and Numeracy programs.

STRATEGIES

Provide release time for teachers to gather and interrogate learning data. This data will be used to inform practice/pedagogy. It will involve investigation, interpretation of results and reporting. It will result in identifying learning gaps and designing learning goals and plans for students.

- > Data will be used to ensure that term curriculum planning and units of work meet the unique needs of the learners at Bald Hills SS.
- > Employ teacher aides to improve number and reading based on class data – Level Literacy Program; Read It Again
- > Release teacher to engage and implement differentiation program targeting Years 2-5 U2B.
- > Purchase resourcing to support English Seven Steps to Writing; Spelling mastery; PM readers; Comprehension, PROBE
- > Improve instruction by immersing and providing professional development to enable teachers to teach within the expectations of the Bald Hills Pedagogical Framework (with a focus on pedagogy, shared practice). This is to enable students to learn at their utmost. Focus will be on developing teacher capability in explicit teaching practices and Co Teaching.
- > Improve instruction by training an additional 2 coaches in Classroom Profiling. Focus on shared practice and building capacity of staff.

TALK, LISTEN, LEARN TOGETHER Cont'd

Encourage children to question. Since children have a natural tendency to question, the best way to encourage them is to give clear, interesting answers. Too often we say, "Be quiet" or. Absentmindedly, "M-m-m".

Ask Questions of Your Child

Questioning isn't one way. Parents, like teachers, need to be continually asking questions, including ones that require more than 'yes', 'no', or 'I don't know'. Ask for opinions, suggestions. And don't be put off with 'Nothing" when you ask 'What did you do at school today?' Try a more specific tact: ask about friends, reading time, craft work, even 'Any good jokes today?'

Show the value of questions. Don't always have the answers, giving the impression that adults are know-alls. Sometimes say, 'Let's look for an answer in the dictionary' or online etc. Or you could suggest, 'Ask your teacher tomorrow.' And demonstrate regularly that you are yourself asking and

answering questions all day. Eg. "Let's make an orange cake ... Now, what dishes do I need?....What ingredients?...etc.

BALD HILLS STATE SCHOOL -INTERESTING BITS AND PIECES

Myth buster fact!

Bald Hills State School was opened in June 1866 and was given the school number 0004. Many people thought this number



meant that Bald Hills was the 4th school to open in Queensland. However, this number came about because the schools that existed in Queensland at that time were listed in alphabetical order and numbered, and consequently Bald Hills was given the number 4. There were 44 children enrolled in the school and the first Head Teacher was Mr Walker. Fast forward 150 years and Bald Hills State School has an enrolment total of over 600 students, the Head Teacher, now called the Principal is Mr Robertson. We also have a Deputy Principal, a Head of Curriculum, a Master teacher, 35 teachers, 12 teacher aides and 4 office staff. Our little country school has grown a lot in 150 years!

Rule of the Week

Our PBL focus rule for this week is to 'Walk when moving around the school' and be safe with Safety Sam. Teachers will be looking for students following these expectations:

- Walk on all hard surfaces—
 concrete and paved areas
 Walk in a sensible and considerate
- Walk in a sensible and considerate way

- Running allowed on playing surfaces only—tennis court, basketball court, junior oval and senior oval
- Play safely in the playground
- No running or chasing around the playground equipment

Playground withdrawal

We are currently reviewing our detention room processing, beginning with a change in wording. We will now be calling the detention room 'playground withdrawal' and have several different programs operating each day including:

- * Interviews related inappropriate behaviours to our PBL explicit behaviours
- * A yard duty team (using adequate hygiene measures) to ensure students are not sitting idly after completing their Interview
- * Alternate play/social skilling programs for those who are requiring further support with their play

If your child has tuckshop on the same day that they have playground withdrawal then they will be able to collect their tuckshop meal, but will have to carry over any ice blocks to the following day.






