YEAR 2 LEARNING UPDATE TERM 1, 2023

ENGLISH

'Exploring informative texts'

We read, view and listen to a range of texts to understand and compare the text structures and language features of imaginative and informative texts. We create an informative text with a supporting image to report on key facts about an Australian animal.

Assessment

<u>Assessment Task 1</u> – Written Informative Text about an Australian animal

<u>Assessment Task 2</u> – Oral Presentation, using the information they gather at home

MATHEMATICS

We start the year revising number and place-value concepts explored in Year 1. We are working with 2-digit numbers; making numbers with various concrete materials, writing numbers as words, using number symbols, subitizing numbers and finding numbers on number lines. We also work on addition and subtraction. We use count on and count back strategies, concrete materials and learn how to record our thinking.

In measurement we revise the days of the week and months of the year.

We also investigate data by posing questions, collecting and displaying data sets (graphs) and interpreting data from a variety of displays.

Assessment

Student portfolio of work, including formative and summative assessments to measure individual student needs and personal improvement, work samples and checklist observations completed with teachers.

SCIENCE

'Growing & Changing'

In this unit students explore how living things grow, change and have offspring. Students will explore the different characteristics of life stages in animals and plants. Students will discuss and compare observations and represent and communicate their understanding and ideas using images and words.
