**Reduction of red tape in day-to-day work, planning and processes include:**

- Key priority Professional Learning Teams (PLTs) are scheduled to meet and present professional learning during staff meeting times
- Class Information Sessions, Parent Teacher Conferences and reporting – time allocated for meetings and planning during staff meeting times
- CPMs are scheduled fortnightly, with the provision of extra 1 hr NCT/fortnight – specialist subject to be taught, assessed and reported on by a specialist teacher
- Seeking staff voice about any extra tasks suggested to ensure that they are aligned directly to their roles and benefit teaching and learning with a view to reviewing systematic procedures to streamline workflow for all staff
